Baptist History #34, Middle Colonies, contd.

Delaware. Baptists were in Delaware as early in 1703 when the Welsh Tract church, which had been formed two years earlier in Pennsylvania, moved there. It remained the only Baptist church in Delaware until 1779, when three Separate Baptist churches were formed. By 1790 Delaware had eight churches, five of them affiliated with the Philadelphia Association. Perhaps the most influential of these was the Welsh Tract Church, which in 1710 adopted a covenant and rules of discipline which later served as a pattern for other churches.

New Jersey. Baptist work progressed more slowly in New Jersey. For some reason, the Great Awakening had less impact there, and by 1790 the state had only 30 churches and 2,247 members. However, these churches, for the most part, reflected doctrinal and spiritual stability, with a greater degree of cooperation between the churches. When the Dutch relinquished New Netherlands in 1664, one effect was to open the Jersey territory to greater settlement. Four of the original twelve participants in the Monmouth Patent were Baptists, one of them Obadiah Holmes, Jr., son of the Newport pastor. Baptists show up in other settlements from 1665 onward, but no church was organized until 1688. In that year Thomas Killingsworth, recently arrived from England formed several Baptist families into a church at Middletown. Like Elias Keach, who preached in Pennsylvania and New Jersey at about that time, Killingsworth traveled extensively. He helped organize several other churches, including Piscataway, 1689; Burlington, 1689; and Cohansey, 1690. These churches later became the nucleus of the Philadelphia Baptist Association. Most of the churches were Regular Baptists, though a few professed some form of General Baptist doctrines. The Seventh-Day Baptists formed a church in New Jersey in 1705, and within a few years had five such churches. As elsewhere, most of these had their origin from the Sab-batarians of Rhode Island.

History of Cane Creek Baptist Church
2020 Cane Creek Rd
Cookeville, TN 28506
1868-2018

Prior to the organization of Cane Creek Baptist Church, the residents of that area had to travel many miles, on horseback, in order to worship in God's house.

Mr. and Mrs. Lewis P. Gentry would travel some ten (10) miles from the neighborhood of the present Cane Creek Baptist Church, to the church then called Brown's Mill, now known as Caney Fork Baptist Church, in Putnam County TN, Stone Association.

Lewis Gentry had a dream of a church close by; a church near enough to his farm that he might take his family all year long, rather than for only those few Sundays that the weather would permit such a long journey to worship.

In the mid 1860's, Bro. James Alfred Myers, a native of Cumberland County, TN conducted a revival in Putnam County. At this revival, Bro.

Myers met and fell in love with a young lady by the name of Nancy Stone, who later became his wife and they purchased a farm in the Cane Creek Community.

In the year 1868, two years after Bro. Myers moved to that community, and through his efforts and those of other dedicated Christians in this area, the Cane Creek Christian Baptist Church was organized, with some ninety (90) charter members. Bro. Myers became the first pastor of this congregation.

The present church building was constructed around 1905, and was remodeled in 1968. Some additions have been added since then and a fellowship hall constructed in 2017. Dr. James McAfee is the current pastor
