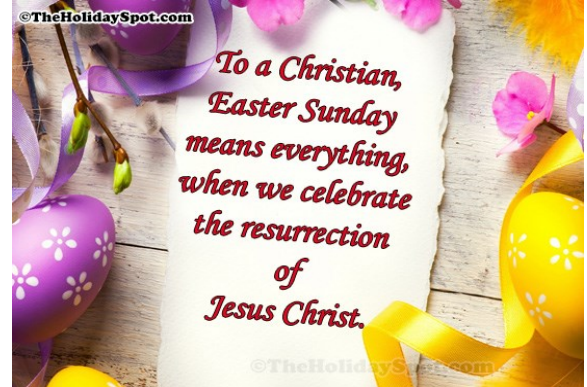

FROM YOUR

DIRECTOR of MISSIONS

I remember camping one night at Cumberland Gap State Park. The children were small with the youngest still in diapers and we were in a tent. It didn't rain another drop the rest of the night. We got up and had breakfast, loaded the station wagon with our soaking wet gear and began to pull out of the camping area and the rain came in a deluge again! Wow! Since then, I have often been reminded that our loving Lord cares about both the huge and the small things in our lives and wants to help us, if we will only ask Him. Has it been "raining" in your life lately? Have you talked to Jesus about it? He will answer you.

DID YOU KNOW?

Baptist History #32, Middle Colonies contd.

New York. The Dutch Colony of New Netherlands (later New York) had a few Baptists by the 1650's, probably immigrants from Rhode Island, but no organized church appeared until 1714. Later New York became a pivotal state for Baptist growth throughout the Northeast, providing leadership in education, church extension, and missions. Data about early Baptist activity comes from a paper on "The State of Religion" in New Netherlands, prepared in 1657 by two Reformed ministers. They reported: "Last year (1656) a fomenter of evil came there. He was a cobbler from Rhode Island. . . and stated he was commissioned by Christ. He began to preach at Flushing and then went with the people into the river and dipped them. This becoming known here, the constable proceeded thither and brought him along. He was banished from the province." The cobbler was William Wickendon, pastor of the historic Providence church. Not only was Wickendon fined and banished but also the sheriff of Flushing who had permitted Baptist services was removed from office.

Around 1700 another company of Baptists gathered at Oyster Bay, on Long Island, and heard occasional preaching by William Rhodes, a Six-Principle Baptist from Rhode Island. The records do not reveal when their church was organized, but it was likely shortly before 1724 when Robert Feeds was ordained their pastor.

More stable Baptist beginnings center around Nicholas Eyres, who migrated from England to New York City in 1711. He became interested in the Baptist way and invited Valentine Wightman of Groton, Connecticut, to hold services in the loft of his brewery as early as 1712. Wightman's preaching garnered about a dozen converts. From fear of persecution, the five women converts were immersed before daylight, but at the last moment the seven men disdained such secrecy as a lack of faith. Eyres determined to baptize them publicly and appealed to the governor for protection. The governor not only granted protection but also attend the baptismal service and later reportedly said, "This was the ancient way of baptizing, and in my opinion much preferable to the practice of modern times." The First Baptist Church was formed in 1714 in Eyres's home, and he was ordained its pastor.
