Did You Know!

Baptist History #17

Baptist Beginnings in the Southern Colonies

Because Baptists predominate the South today, many assume they have always been numerous in that area, but such is not the case. Baptists got a late start in the South; and after a hundred years of witness in America, they could number only a handful of small churches scattered over the Southern Colonies. In Virginia and parts of South Carolina the Anglican (Church of England) Church assumed the status of establishment, which brought severe restrictions upon other denominations. Some of the most severe persecution Baptists faced in America occurred in the South before disestablishment put all the churches on an even footing in the next century.

The area we call South Carolina was granted by charter in 1663 by King Charles II to a group of proprietors headed by John Colleton and Ashley Cooper. They brought an expedition of about 150 settlers in 1670 and settled Port Royal but about 1680 moved a few miles to the bank of the Ashley River and named the settlement "Charles Towne" (now Charleston) for the king. They allowed religious liberty and from the first the colony prospered.

Many of the early settlers came from the west of England, a Baptist stronghold and the evidence confirms that a number of Baptists were among them. One careful historian spoke of a "Baptist Migration" to early South Carolina but admitted that it was difficult to identify these Baptists because early records of the colony identify all non-Anglicans simply as "dissenters." Probably these early Baptists met occasionally for worship as a "house church." Though they had neither pastor nor formal organization, there remains a persistent tradition of Baptist worship in Charleston from the 1680's.

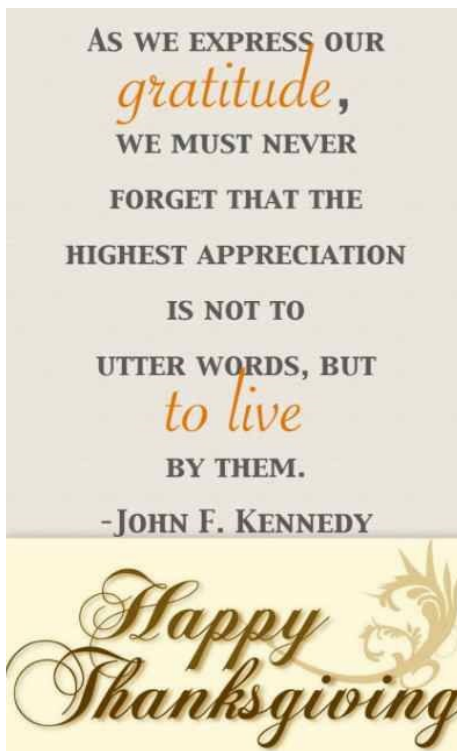

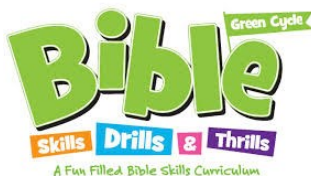
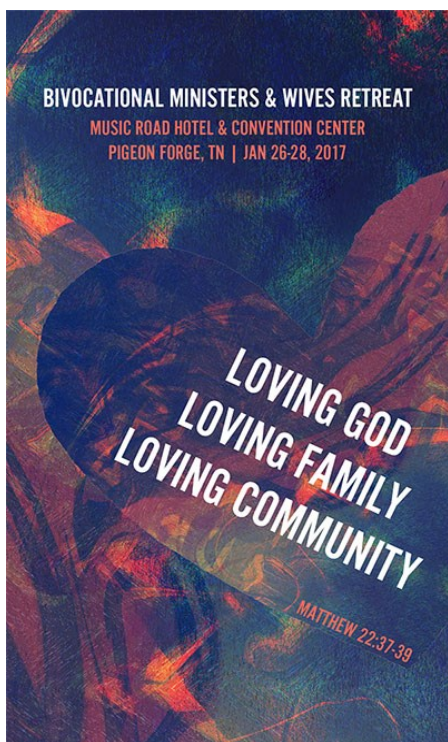

MISSIONS MOMENT

"We noticed last night a gratifying increase in attendance of the preaching service. Our mission leader says the night service is the 'trap' he has set to catch any Nicodemus who may fear ridicule for coming by day. One in a Christian land cannot begin to understand the terrible, almost unsurmountable obstacles in the way of these people. It is only the grace of God that can give a man courage to trample these obstacles underfoot and come out bravely as a Christian...In the face of all these things, we believe a Christian society is growing up in China. A leaven is at work which shall penetrate into all this vast empire." Letter from Lottie Moon on April 16, 1874 (six months into her service).

Foreign scholars estimate that there are 67 million to **100 million Christians** in China—compared with 87 million Communist Party cadres. Yang estimates that China will be home to **250 million Christians** by 2030. Evangelical Protestants are the fastest growing group. (December 23, 2015, Washington Post.)

As we celebrate the life and legacy of Lottie Moon this Christmas season, remember the impact that one faithful witness can have for Christ. Lottie was called by God to the mission field, yet inspired by the work of her little sister before her. When you share the gospel with one person, when you train up one youth or young adult to get involved in God's work, when you give to and pray for our missionaries, God may very well take your effort and reach missions with His grace. Together we can do more for the Kingdom, and together God can do more through His people.
